



Call for applications: Intensive two-day Media Lab

We invite applications to join a two-day intensive Media Lab with professional training and production in either podcasting or print journalism, at the University of Glasgow. We have spaces for 12 participants on this innovative scheme, with six available in podcast journalism and production and six available in print journalism and production.

The workshops are free and open to everyone with experience of migration. Although prior media experience isn't necessary, all applicants must demonstrate a strong interest in journalism.

Participation will be recognised with a Certificate of Completion from the University of Glasgow and Migrant Voice.

Participants who are not fluent in English are invited to complete the application with support from someone else as needed, and answers can be in languages other than English. We can provide interpretation services at the workshops for those who need them.

The Media Lab will take place on **May 25th and 26th from 10am to 4pm**. You sign up for either two days of podcasting or two days of print journalism training. Attendance is required for the full sessions as each group will produce a publication/broadcast that will be distributed widely, as well as shared at a subsequent event on June 21st (to which participants will also be invited). Travel expenses will be reimbursed.

- The podcast lab will include: training in sound recording, interviewing, editing in Audacity, and digital storytelling techniques
- The print lab will include: training on Adobe InDesign, the industry standard for print journalism; editorial meetings with working journalists to shape a publication; news and feature writing.

Both labs will produce work on a set theme, which will be shared in the run-up to the labs once participants are confirmed.
